Walk up from Cadora Woods to see Susan’s vegetable garden with at least 8 varieties of beans, wildflower meadow with views of the Wye Valley, borders, grasses, and small wood.</p> <p>Then drive over the bridge to the Old Station Tintern for refreshments before walking up to Matt and Freyja’s ‘One Planet’ plot. This interesting initiative aims for near self-sufficiency and includes no-dig annual vegetables, fruit trellises, and an orchard. Learn about the perennial food forest that they planted last year.</p>

As the country’s only complete surviving example of the rococo period, the garden provides a unique insight into the life of the upper middle classes in the 1740s.</p> <p>Dominic’s talk explores the garden’s origins, its rococo heyday, its subsequent evolution, and its rescue from ruin since the 1980s.</p>
